

Southeast Asia's COVID-19 Vaccine Roll-out

Cambodia	COVAX, China, India; <i>Sputnik V, AstraZeneca</i>	12 million	37%	First batch of Sinopharm vaccinations began 10 Feb, for people aged between 18 and 59; 16,612 people have been vaccinated so far. COVAX is set to distribute 1.3 million doses in H1 2021.
Indonesia	AstraZeneca, Sinopharm, Sinovac, Merah Putih, Novavax; <i>Pfizer, Sputnik V</i>	Approx. 329 million	61%	Indonesia began vaccinations for the general public on 8 Feb, starting with those aged 59 years and above. The government has calculated that 182 million people can be vaccinated in 2021. Vaccination will be compulsory for Indonesian citizens, with sanctions imposed including suspension of social aid for those who refuse.
Laos	COVAX, Sinopharm, Sputnik V	N/A	20%	Laos has started administering the Sinopharm vaccine to over 600 medical workers in Vientiane. The country expects to vaccinate 22% of its population this year, reaching 70% by 2023.
Myanmar	COVAX, Covishield, China	30 million	28%	Healthcare workers started receiving the Covishield vaccine from 27 Jan. More than 380,000 people over 65 years old were vaccinated on 5 Feb, in 34 Yangon townships.
Singapore	Moderna, Pfizer, Sinovac, local	N/A	100%	55,000 people are fully vaccinated with the Pfizer vaccine. Singapore aims to complete vaccination between Oct-Dec 2021. Singapore's 60-69 year old residents will start to be vaccinated from the end of March.
Thailand	AstraZeneca, Sinovac, local	64 million	46%	Thai Airways will fly in the first 200,000 doses of Sinovac on 24 Feb, with first doses aimed at medical personnel and those 60 years and above. Later deliveries of vaccines to reach tourism and service workers.
Vietnam	AstraZeneca, COVAX, Sputnik V local; <i>China, Pfizer</i>	60 million	43%	Vietnam will receive 200,400 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine on 28 Feb. The first phase of vaccination will go to 5 million frontline workers. Vietnam has negotiated 60 million out of the 150 million doses needed in 2021 to cover 70% of its population.
